


General Background

STEP 1: REGISTRATIONS

- Be 18 years old or above
- In possession of proof of residence
- Register in person
- Reside within the same municipal jurisdiction

STEP 2: NOMINATIONS







- Obtain support, in writing, from 200-500 community members residing within the same municipal jurisdiction
- Nomination forms: available at the local IEC offices for 3 days
- Publishing of shortlisted nominees
- Objection period
- SIOC-cdt vetting process
- Final nominee list publishing

STEP 3: INTERVIEWS

Community panel interviews with nominees

STEP 4: VOTING PROCESS



- To participate, you should have registered to vote
- Name must appear on the voters roll
- Election process overseen by Independent Electoral Commission
- Voting at various voting stations within each municipal area

WHO CAN BE A SIOC-CDT TRUSTEE?

Section 20(2) of the Trust Property Control Act, 1988 (Act 57 of 1988) stipulates that a Trustee should be a person who never has been:

- ⇒ convicted of any offence of dishonesty or sentenced to prison without a fine option
- ⇒ sequestrated or liquidated or placed under judicial management
- ⇒ removed from office in respect to any appointment as a Trustee
- ⇒ declared with a mental health disability/incapacitated

In addition, the SIOC-cdt trust deed specifies the following criteria. A person does not qualify to be appointed as a Trustee if:

- \Rightarrow over 70 years of age
- ⇒ working for government or parliament in any capacity

The nominated person must:

- ⇒ Have matric or higher
- ⇒ Reside within the municipal jurisdiction for which you are nominated
- ⇒ At least be able to read and/or write English
